Our learning this half term:

- To follow our White Rose Maths scheme.
- Adding & subtracting numbers within 10.
- Naming 2d and 3d shapes, and describing their properties.
- Immersing ourselves in our chosen texts linked to our Houses and Homes theme and enjoying our page turner - The Twits by Roald Dahl.
- Using Pie Corbett storytelling words and actions, and mapping to retell the traditional story of The Three Little Pigs.
- Writing simple sentences about houses and homes.
- Identifying different materials such as wood, metal, plastic and paper; soring objects according to what they are made of; describing the properties of materials using words such as hard, soft, rigid, flexible, rough and smooth.
- Investigating and walking around our locality; drawing and labelling maps; identifying different types of
- Designing, making and evaluating a model of a house, with doors and windows that open.
- Singing a variety of songs linked to our Houses and Homes theme.
- Learning and performing a variety of Nativity songs and learning about The First Christmas.

Ongoing learning:

- Individual and shared reading sessions
- Daily Phonics sessions
- Learning weekly spellings
- Handwriting using correct cursive letter formation & joining letters.
- Learn number bonds of 10 off by heart. Forming all numbers correctly.
- Writing simple sentences independently. Including finger spaces between words. Using CLs and FS correctly. Use 'and' to extend sentences.
