Also thank you to all the staff who gave their additional time and ensured that the whole experience was fun, informative and even the lengthy trip home due to road issues did not dampen any spirits!

Before Easter, we will be taking our Year 6 on their residential visit to Thorpe Woodlands – more details about the trip will be following home soon for those children taking part. Please remember that full and final payment must be received no later than the 1<sup>st</sup> February to guarantee your child's place. If you are experiencing difficulties with payment, please contact Mrs Barkworth at the main office as soon as possible.

We will also be offering the children in Year 5 a chance to undertake four half days of Bikeability training, Years 3 & 4 are visiting the Regent Theatre in Ipswich for a live performance whilst Year 2 are off on a visit to Framlingham Castle as part of their project - there's always lots to do!

Our staff will also be hosting Parents' Evening appointments on the weeks before and after half term please see the calendar dates at the end of this Newsletters for details of when your child's class will be holding theirs. Following the success and positive feedback we had from holding a mixture of virtual and face-to-face appointments in the autumn term, we will be holding this term's meetings in the same manner.

### School Carpark, Parking & Road Safety

Once again, we have received complaints from local residents, pedestrians and road users about parking at the front of the school. Please be mindful of how and where you park, ensure that you leave sufficient room for pedestrians, prams/buggies, wheelchairs to use the pathways and be aware of your surroundings before you park on pavements. We have also had reports of neighbours being spoken to rudely/abusively when being asked to move their vehicles. Please be courteous in and around the school area.

**Please do not park in the carpark** - this is for staff and professionals visiting the school. Children should not be brought into the carpark area, it is very difficult to see pedestrians moving around in this small, tight space, especially at the beginning and end of the school day as there is so much traffic moving around it is extremely dangerous for children to be in this area.

On occasions when the weather looks likely to cause disruption to the normal running of school, we will post an update via parentmail and social media as quickly as we can once a site inspection has taken place. Messages will read as one of three options:

- 1. School open as normal
- 2. School closed online learning day
- 3. Inclement weather plan

If option three is decided upon, the day will run as follows. <u>Please note that there would be NO breakfast</u> or afterschool clubs if we are operating option 3.

Delaying the start of school for an hour enables staff and families extra time to make their commute. Similarly, by finishing an hour earlier, commutes can happen in the daylight. Up to 40% of our staff are not local and some travel up to an hour. If we are to open the school, we must always adhere to safe ratios.

We understand that disruption of any kind, including inclement weather plans or in the very worst case, a closure causes problems for many families, especially for working parents. We will always try our best to open as normal, but safety for all is our number one priority.

In the event of inclement weather, we will also ask families to ensure that children have enough layers to be outside if it is safe to do so and that they are wearing suitable footwear.

### 'Trimley Treasure Trove'

We have secured a new, dedicated area in school to house our 'pantry' and second hand uniform – the 'Trimley Treasure Trove'. A big thank you to our wonderful staff, their families and the Felixstowe Hockey Club who have provided everything in our store. We are currently working to be able secure more regular resources.

If you would like to make use of our food store, please call into the TTT - it is open on weekday mornings 8:55 - 9:10am and accessed at the side of the school between the wooden and red gates (using the pedestrian entrance by the traffic light crossing). If you are unable to access the store at these times, but would like to use it, please call the office to arrange an alternative, mutually convenient time. We also have a good supply of second hand uniform and some non-uniform clothing items as part of our reuse & recycle scheme. This will be available for you to browse through at the Parent Evening sessions and is available at alternative times too - please ask at the office. If you have any items of clothing that you would like to add to our clothes bank, they can be donated to our TTT via the main office. We can only accept clean, good condition clothing please.

We are also considering adding a library to our TTT, if you have any good quality books which your children have outgrown and you are happy to pass on to new homes, we will be happy to receive them. Some books may even be used to add to our libraries within school!

# Quick Reminders:

\* Please ensure that there is sufficient dinner money in your child's account, BEFORE meals are taken. We are unable to allow debts to accrue.

\* If you think that you may be eligible for benefit related Free School Meals (including those children in EYFS & KS1) please apply to Suffolk County Council – it only takes a couple of minutes and allows us to be able to support you and your family in various ways.

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit but **no element of Working Tax Credit** and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month), as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
