Dear Parent/Carer,



She was instrumental in the further development of the outdoor learning areas around the school; believed strongly in the creative curriculum, ensuring a broad, balanced and engaging education for our children, allowing all to flourish and grow. Children think of themselves as artists, writers, scientists, historians, as they are taught to believe and achieve, we wonder how many will go on to become our future engineers, technicians, nurses, doctors, scientists and other worthwhile careers.

She successfully navigated the school through the pandemic, helping to keep us all safe and well. Following and keeping abreast of the ever-changing rules and guidance, not an easy task at the best of times, but incredibly stressful as a leader in education. She helped us all transition as school life returns to 'normal', with school trips and visitors in, this summer term has been busier than ever.

Retirement is the end of one phase of life and the beginning of a new, exciting chapter. We are sure you will join us in wishing her well as she embarks on her new venture.



### Moving forward here are some of your comments on what we could improve on.

#### Communication: -

There was a 60-40 split with comments ranging from excellent communication to virtually no communication/really poor. This also varied widely within the same year group, with no obvious pattern for us to work on.

Please be aware that the bulk of communications do go out via parentmail, make sure the school has your up-to-date email contact details. When emailing class teachers try to do so before 8.30am, teachers tend to be busy with their class after this time. You can also email after school but staff will not usually respond out of hours but will respond the following morning. We did have one interesting comment re the number of apps you have to log onto, particularly in early years. Whilst we agree, unfortunately they all cover different aspects of your child's learning and there isn't an app out there that does it all (yet), we are always looking for improvements. Keep an eye out for newsletters, also sent out via parentmail, as these give forward notice of events for your diary. We have had a few events that were hurriedly arranged due to us being allowed to return normal activities/trips etc. We will endeavour to keep you well informed.

## Sports and more outdoor learning: -

Many of you mention a wish to see an increase in P.E and inter school competition. You will be pleased to hear this has already begun. Our school recently hosted area sports, five other local schools attended and competed in athletic type events. Parent/carers will be able to come and cheer on their children as they take part in KS1 and KS2 sports days. You will be pleased to hear that from September all year groups, on rotation, will have the opportunity to take part in Forest School Activities. This is in addition to using the playground equipment on the field and top playground, these too, are used by all year groups in rotation.

#### Homework: -

A few of you felt the amount of homework given is too great, feeling that children should be able to relax. Again, a tricky issue to balance and worth discussing. There was also mention of too much screen time, if you are concerned you are entitled to request a paper copy of the homework set.

Lunch Options were mentioned, looking for more variety, healthier and possibly packed lunch type options. These will be discussed with our provider.

A couple of you reported your children were having friendship issues, citing the possibility of bullying occurring, any form of bullying is taken seriously at this school, it is logged, reported to governors and acted upon. A lot of work is undertaken in school around healthy relationships and building children's confidence in dealing with, talking about and reporting issues. We must work on these together, do keep discussing with your child and their teacher. We will also of course speak to the year groups concerned.

#### More opportunities to come into school: -

Some commented that they would like to come into school for more face -to -face parent/teacher consultations and to view children's work. Again, as we return to some form of 'normality', after two years of disruption/restrictions during the pandemic, we have already taken cautious steps to inviting you in with open evenings, where parent/carers came in to view children's work. It was great to see so many children proudly sharing their work with their grown-ups. We also recently hosted a well -attended reading workshop for EYFS year 1 parent /carers. Years 3&4 show cased their learning to parents in the hall earlier in the summer term and the PTA summer fair was a success. Finally, to complete this term, Year 6 will be starring in their production, in front of their parent/carers. It is hoped we can continue down the road to 'normality' as we go into the autumn term, when we can invite you in to share more of your children's learning.
