Our learning this half term:

- To continue to follow our progression in maths using White Rose Maths - the 4 operations, ratio, algebra, fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Recall multiplication facts in any order.
- Developing reading skills using extracts from texts.
- Writing a variety of genres e.g. poetry, narratives and non-fiction texts etc.
- As scientists, learning about electricity and components in a circuit.
- As historians, looking at WWII.
- As geographers, studying population and asking 'Why does population change?'
- Continuing to explore the French language through speaking, listening and writing.
- As artists, looking at and creating observational drawings, using different media and looking at portraits of different style
- In DT, designing and creating props for the production and recreating wartime recipes
- Developing our P.E. skills in tennis, cricket and athletics.
- In computing, creating quizzes and learning about the binary system.
- In R. E., study Christianity, the Resurrection and how it alters Christians' view of life and death.
- As musicians, creating our own music inspired by female artists
- Performing songs in music and sharing with the class.
