

EYFS Homework Grid - Autumn 1

All children at Trimley St Mary will receive a homework grid each half term. You might like to complete an activity weekly. This homework is **OPTIONAL**.

You may like to complete some of these activities on paper to hand in to your teacher or you can upload work to your Tapestry page.

Regular reading and maths activities should continue to be practised - please see the grid below for more details.















Literacy focus:

We are learning letter names and sounds as part of phonics. Can you recognise any letters or sounds around you? You might like to read street signs or signs in shops. You might choose to look at a book with a grown up.

Maths focus:

Go on a shape hunt. What shapes can you see around your house or local area.

Can you name the shapes you have found? Are the shapes you have found flat 2d shapes or 3d shapes?

Personal, Social and Emotion Development focus:

Play a game or complete a puzzle with your grown ups, focus on waiting and taking turns. It is good to learn that we win and loose games. There is a snakes and ladders game attached (you will need a dice and counters to play). You may use games or puzzles from home.

Physical Development focus:

Let's get dressed. When we get dressed there are lots of different physical skills needed. Have a go at dressing yourself using the different fastenings to secure your clothes. You might like to try;

- zips
- buttons
- shoe fastenings such as laces, Velcro or buckles
- poppers



Expressive arts and design focus:

Draw a picture of you and your family. You might like to try to write labels of who is in your picture (or your grown up can write for you).

Understanding the world focus:

Have a walk around your local area.

What do you see?

Have you seen any wildlife or plants growing? You might like to collect some objects to create a picture.

You could take photographs of the things you have found. You might like to create a picture or map of your walk and label the features.

Daily practice of key skills allows children to become more fluent and more confident. As the term continues you will receive a reading book and library book. It is important for your child to complete daily reading to develop both their phonetic knowledge (to read words) and develop their comprehension (understanding of what has been read). You can enjoy talking about your book and answering questions.

We will also be sending home 'Starting School Packs' soon which will include Literacy and Maths resources so you can practise maths skills including; number recognition, counting and ordering numbers and the use of Numicon.
