What makes me who I am?



All children at Trimley St Mary will receive a homework grid each half term. This homework is OPTIONAL. You may like to complete some of these activities on paper to hand in to your teacher or you can upload work to your SeeSaw page. Regular reading and maths activities should continue to be practised - please see the grid on the next page for more details.

English



Practise your letter formation and handwriting. Practise writing your name. Choose a letter family and practise writing the letters in this book. Or why not take your learning outside and use chalks, water or paint to create giant letters? Upload your photos on SeeSaw for us to see.

English & Art



Draw or paint a picture of yourself - a self-portrait. Label the different parts of your body. Why not write a sentence to tell us something about yourself too?

<u>Science</u>



Recall your 5 senses - go on a Senses walk. What can you see? Hear? Smell? Touch? Taste? Draw and label what you discovered. You might like to take photos and stick them onto paper, or upload your images to your SeeSaw page.

<u>History</u>



What were you like when you were a baby? How have you changed? What can you do now that you couldn't do in the past? Why not ask your grown ups to look at some baby photos. Draw a picture to show what you looked like. Why not write some simple sentences too?

PSHE



Make a friendship poster, including pictures and words about how to be a good friend. You could look on your SeeSaw page for all the songs we've sung in school, to give you more ideas. Scan the QR code above to sing the "Let's be friends" song.

Design Technology



Using Lego or any building bricks you have at home, create a model of your home. You could take a photo and upload it to your SeeSaw page - type a short sentence, or record a message, telling us what you've made.

Daily practice of key skills allows children to become more fluent and more confident, and gives them the chance to build on this knowledge. In reading, maths and phonics it has been shown that children who regularly practice skills and complete activities in a range of contexts are better able to apply these skills in all areas.



Daily reading

Share your Reading or Library Book, or a book of your own, with a grown up. Enjoy talking about your book and answering questions. Don't forget to complete and return your Reading Challenge Slip every Monday - house points, raffle tickets and class prizes are available.



Phonics/Spelling practise
