Dear Parents & Carers

We are enjoying being back in school for the spring term - and a very busy term it's going to be!

We are looking forward to our two biggest trips of the school year, the forthcoming visit to Leicester Space Centre at the beginning of February for Years 5 & 6, whilst Year 6 will be taking part in their residential visit to Thorpe Woodlands in March.

Year 5 will be busy learning their cycling skills and road safety with four sessions of Bikeability training, whilst Year 2 are off learning about Framlingham Castle with Years 3 & 4 having a Roman experience at Colchester Castle and Year 1 are studying animals at Colchester Zoo. Also, our EYFS children are visiting the Felixstowe library and learning about sharing books and stories and all this before the Easter break!

After Easter we will be continuing the activities that support and enhance out learning outside of the classroom with planned visits to the Farm & Country Fair, Easton Farm Park, Foxburrow Farm and Landguard Fort.

We have also been polishing up our sports skills with local tournaments of football at Portman Road and Yr 6 are taking part in a swimming gala next week.

Car Park Safety & Changes

As you are aware, the carpark is strictly for use by staff and visitors to our school, this is due to the lack of space and to ensure the safety of everyone.

We are aware of a limited number of people that may use the carpark to support their individual circumstances - they have confirmed their number plates with us, so we are aware of those vehicles. Anyone else using the carpark will be asked to move their vehicle off site immediately.

The carpark is a very busy area with limited vision for drivers and it is not considered a safe area to walk children across, especially at the busiest times of the day – school drop off and collection. We have a constant movement of vehicles throughout the day and delivery vehicles too so please use the designated pedestrian access and do not use the carpark area.

Early Mornings

Please remember that children should not be on school site before 8:40am, especially those unsupervised by their adult. Children who are on site are not monitored by staff and therefore if they have an accident or there is an emergency, we would not be aware of the child's presence or need for assistance.

If your child arrives early, especially if unescorted by an adult due to parent/carer needing to leave for work early, please do not drop them off before 8:40am. The Breakfast Club, run by Ipswich Town, is available from 7:40am and bookable on a daily basis to support working parents.

Attendance & Absences

Please remember that if your child is unwell, you should contact the school by 9:30am, where possible. You can inform us of a child's illness by Parentmail, email <u>office@trimley.net</u> or by leaving a message on the absence line (this service opens at 8:30am).

As you will be aware from news coverage over the last few months, the Department for Education (DFE) are concerned about children's school attendance and the increase of the amount of time some children are missing from school.

Naturally, school is about education and the learning of new things/experiences, but it is also an important factor for children to build friendships to develop and nurture social skills, understand why sometimes we need to follow routines and how this can help in daily lives now, as they grow older and eventually have families of their own.

With this in mind, we would like to remind families that term time holidays, unless for exceptional circumstances, will not be authorised. In line with our schools' Attendance Policy, <u>6 or more</u> school sessions (3 school days) will incur a Penalty Notice of £60 per child/per parent. Repeated unauthorised absences will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) where further action may be taken.

Attendance is part of our school's building blocks of Safeguarding and keeping children safe, therefore every absence for a child must be recorded accurately.

We would like to thank parents/carers who are open and honest when they choose to withdraw a child from education for a holiday - we understand that the Penalty Notice may not be a welcome letter, but it means that we are able to discuss the holiday with the child. Where the school believes that an "illness" was in fact due to other reasons, such as a day trip or holiday, the school may request further information to be able to authorise the absence.

If we have not heard from a parent/carer by 9:30am with a reason for an absence, we will call home - this is to safeguard everyone and ensure that you know where your child is, as well as school. We will phone all those listed for whom we have contact information and with parental responsibility.

Should we be unable to make contact with anyone, or are concerned, the school will make a home visit after three school days (or earlier if there are additional concerns).

If you are taking a child out of school, for any reason, please ensure that you complete the 'Leave of Absence' form available from the main office, at least a week before the child is taking the leave.

Free School Meals

Please ensure that there is sufficient dinner money in your child's account, BEFORE meals are taken. We are unable to allow debts to accrue. All outstanding amounts must be cleared by the end of the financial year -

If you think that you may be eligible for benefit related Free School Meals (including those children in EYFS & KS1) please apply to Suffolk County Council - it only takes a couple of minutes and allows us to be able to support you and your family in various ways.

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit but **no element of Working Tax Credit** and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work fewer hours per week
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month), as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
