Daily reading and maths activities should continue to be practised – please turn over for details. For the main homework activity each week, children should select a square of the grid to complete and return to school on a Friday. It is expected that every child hands in one piece of homework each week. This can be physical or on Seesaw.

Children will be rewarded for each activity they complete.

<p>Maths:</p> <p>Create a word problem for a family member using one of the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication or division.</p>	<p>Art/DT</p> <p>Create a model Anderson shelter out of different items – these could be items you have around the house.</p> 	<p>History:</p> <p>Create a timeline about the events that happened during World War 2.</p>

Spring Term

Daily practice of key skills allows children to become more fluent and more confident, and gives them the chance to build on this knowledge. In both reading and maths it has been shown that children who regularly practice skills and complete in a range of contexts are better able to apply these skills in all areas.

Daily Reading: By year 6, children should be reading a minimum of 5 times per week, with:

- Excellent phonic knowledge and skills.
- Fluency and accuracy in reading across a wide range of contexts throughout the curriculum.
- Knowledge of an extensive and rich vocabulary.
- An excellent comprehension of texts.
- The motivation to read for both study and for pleasure.
- Extensive knowledge through having read a rich and varied range of texts.
