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Dear Parents & Carers

We've reached the end of another term, with many new experiences for our children.

The Year 6s had an incredible week at Thorpe Woodlands last week and even the weather was fairly kind to us! The children were a credit to the school with good teamwork, a spirit of wanting to try new things and enjoyed a couple of nights away with their friends.

But although Thorpe Woodlands is over for this year, Mrs Filby is already busily planning and booking next year's visit. Further information will be sent home very soon for our current Year 5 children who will be taking part next year.

Year 1 has been exploring animal life and habitats at Colchester Zoo whilst Year 2 have been time travelling to Framlingham Castle with their project on castles and Years 3 & 4 had a fabulous day at Colchester Castle.

EYFS will be off to visit Easton Farm Park after the Easter break to look at new life with the new spring arrivals of lambs etc.

The school works hard to enrich the curriculum and feels that these types of extra activities enhance and bring the learning experiences alive. We fully appreciate that the costs of trips have increased over the last couple of years, this has mainly been due to very large increase in the cost of coach hire, due to fuel increases.

We would like to reassure you that each trip/event is organised with as much care and consideration to costs as possible. More than one coach company is approached to ensure that we get the best price and this is spread evenly between the number of children in the year group, so the voluntary contribution requested is only for your child. On top of this, we also request your child's entry/activity fee. Where possible the school adds funds to the visit and the PTA very kindly offer a donation, specifically for trips and events, which is spread equally over the 7 year groups that we have in school.

Please remember that we suggest a voluntary contribution for your child's costs ONLY. Contributions are voluntary, but should the school not receive sufficient funding to allow the event to take place, we reserve the right to cancel it. Naturally, any funds received from parents/carers would be refunded in the event of this happening.

# **Building Works**

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for your patience and understanding with the changes to school access whilst the building works are taking place. We understand that the changes to access may have caused some inconvenience, but this has been necessary to ensure that the site is safe for all. Building work is reduced at the beginning and end of the school day so that parents and carers can drop off/collect children, but rest assured it is a very much in progress throughout the day! The works on the roof have been progressing well, despite the weather and the classrooms and areas in EYFS Yr1 have been completed. The next stage is the kitchen and main hall - work which is planned to take place over the Easter break due to the massive impact that this will have on the building.

Reduced access to the site will continue after the break and we will advise you of any changes to the entrances/exits for your child if/when they place as they occur.

Once again, many thanks for your patience and understanding with this matter, which is entirely out of our hands.

#### <u>Attendance</u>

As you are aware, the Department for Education are changing Fixed Penalty Notices with effect from September, our Attendance Policy will be amended over the summer in line with their new guidelines and we will keep you up to date of any changes.

Please remember that term time holidays will not be authorised, except in exceptional circumstances, but you MUST inform the school at least a week in advance of any planned leave of absence, the relevant form to advise of this is available from the main office. The DFE guidelines state that absences cannot be authorised on or after the event. All absence requests are considered on an individual basis. Where the school feels that an absence has been reported by parent/carer as illness and it is believed that this was not the case, the school may request further information.

We appreciate that holidays outside of term time are more expensive - we understand this very well as school staff are also restricted by term times. However, school attendance is another of the foundation blocks to a good, rounded education whilst allowing the building of social skills and friendships. Please book family holidays outside of term time.

Please be advised that for children with known medical conditions, reasonable adjustments allowing an individual attendance target is agreed. The school actively works with families to arrange school activities around the child's individual needs.

Well done to all the children over this term for all your hard work - this is shown by the huge number of house points that have been awarded this term, which are collected for their House colour. We are pleased to announce that the Green Team have won the greatest number of points this term. As agreed with our children, the winners will be having a non-uniform day. The school cannot allow school meal debts to accrue and asks that should your child's account be in debit, that it is cleared as soon as possible.
