

# Year 4 Homework Grid

## Summer

As you know, all children at Trimley St Mary will receive a homework grid each term. The aim is to give families a starting point for discussion about what is being learned in school and to give children an opportunity to consolidate and extend their understanding. Family life is busy and can be unpredictable: some activities will take more time than others. This grid gives you an opportunity to pick activities that suit the time you have available - as a guide please aim for one activity per week.

We have been so pleased and impressed with the enthusiasm, creativity and commitment shown by the children. Many of you are remembering to complete the Reading Challenge slip and are showing how much times tables learning is being practised at home.

During this term please continue daily reading and any set maths and spelling activities - see details at the bottom of the page. For the main homework activity each week, children should select a square of the grid to complete and return to school on a **day to suit you**. Seesaw returns are always a good way to show homework. Children will be rewarded for each activity they complete.

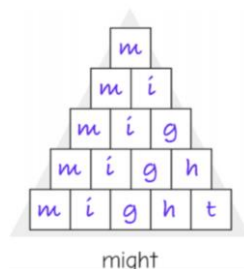


Make a wordsearch with key words all about rivers.
