Moving forward here are some of your comments on what we could improve

Communication: -

Again, there was a range of comments ranging from excellent communication to virtually no communication/really poor. This also varied widely within the same year group, with no obvious pattern for us to work

on. Many commented on the good use of parentmail, tapestry and see-saw keeping them up-to-date with diary events and their child's learning experiences.


Please be aware that the bulk of communications do go out via parentmail, make sure the school has your up-to-date email contact details. When emailing class teachers try to do so before 8.30am, teachers tend to be busy with their class after this time. We are also aware that after the summer term there were a few IT issues, with not all staff emails working as they should have, these should now be resolved.

There was one comment requesting that all children should be taught Makaton, I think you will agree the children confidently sang and signed their way through their Christmas songs in KS1. KS1 children in particular often sign in literacy when they are building up a story board as a class or learning a new story. We agree it is good for children to master all different forms of communication.

Sports, clubs, and more outdoor learning: -

Some comments were very supportive of our after-school provision, a few parents would like to see more sports clubs and more outdoor learning. A few also asked if it was possible to run after school clubs that were not sport orientated. All fair comments, clubs other than those run by Ipswich Town are dependent on staff volunteering their time, tricky in these busy time pressured days.

There were lots of very supportive comments regarding outdoor learning and how much their children enjoyed 'Wild Wednesdays/Forest Thursdays. Staff also enjoy these sessions and comment on how the children thrive, build their confidence, independence, and resilience.



A few of you have commented on concerns regarding the congestion around EYFS gate at drop off and pick up times. We are currently looking into putting in a further gate on the wider, marked playground side, of the blue EYFS fence. This will hopefully ease some of the congestion.

We hope you can see that by working together Headteachers, staff, governors, parents, and carers; in fact, the whole school community, we can work together towards a shared goal, to provide a high-quality education, ensuring everyone can flourish and achieve their best.

We look forward to seeing all that can be achieved this year.
