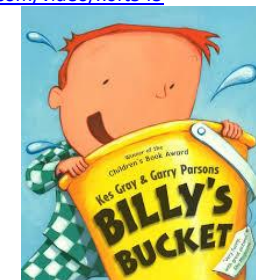
PSHE – Being my Best
