#### Science



Go on a Materials Hunt around your home and garden. Can you find objects made of wood, metal, plastic, glass and paper?

Draw and label them. Write sentences to describe their properties using words such as hard, soft, flexible, rigid, rough or smooth. You might like to take photos too?

#### **PSHE**





Make a friendship poster, including pictures and words about how to be a good friend. You could look on your SeeSaw page for all the songs we've sung in school, to give you more ideas.

### Design Technology



Be a Dynamic Designer and use Lego or any building bricks you have at home to create a model of a London Landmark. You could take a photo and upload it to your SeeSaw page – type a short sentence telling us what you've made. Or take and print a photo and bring it into school.

Daily practice of key skills allows children to become more fluent and more confident, and gives them the chance to build on this knowledge. In reading, maths and phonics it has been shown that children who regularly practice skills and complete activities in a range of contexts are better able to apply these skills in all areas.

Share your Reading or Library Book, or a book of your own, with a grown up. Enjoy talking about your book and answering questions. Don't forget to complete and return your Reading Challenge Slip every Monday - house points, raffle tickets and class prizes are available.
