### Safety on the Playground

As you are aware, it can get very busy at drop off and collection times on the playground. There are a lot of people moving in different directions, and with the pre-school having similar timings, there are a lot of small people about too!

With this in mind, can we please ask that you remind your children about their safety and the safety of others whilst they are playing. It's very easy to get carried away when playing games, so we suggest that grown-ups keep an eye on their child too please and are mindful of where they are playing. We have had a few instances where children on the playground before/after school have run into others resulting in tumbles.

Also, please remember that scooters and cycles should not be ridden on any part of the school property – please push them until off the grounds.

We thank you for your support with this to help ensure that there are no accidents.

#### Parent Governor Vacancy

We currently have a vacancy for a **parent governor** and would be delighted to hear from anyone who is thinking that they might like to become a member of the governing body to support the strategic leadership of our school.

There are no particular qualifications required for the role, but we are looking for someone with the skills relevant to this role.

# Role of a governor:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- Holding senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation, its pupils and the performance management of staff;
- Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

That may sound a little scary at first but there are lots of us on the team, each from different backgrounds and experience. Plenty of help is available. Do come and join us as we need someone who understands the parent experience as well as any other skills you might bring. Your role is to speak for yourself and your experience.

You would not be a parent representative and bring parental issues to us. Any parental problems needs to go directly to the school.

We don't get involved with any day to day matters. We make strategic decisions and ask questions. Governors meet as a Full Governing Body a couple of times a term with some additional sub-committee and intermediate Governor meetings. Governors visit the school during the day for monitoring visits and are encouraged to support school events, where possible. There are always papers to review before a meeting and of course you will need to think about what questions you want to ask.

The official term of office is 4 years, you can give notice at any time during the 4 years but you cannot extend without a voting process.

We are a friendly group and provide lots of support and training for anyone who has never been a governor. You do not need to know about education but we do need you to be interested in wanting to see Trimley St Mary develop further and be enthusiastic about the journey forward.

If more than 1 person applies, we will hold an election, but please do not let this stop you from stepping forward. You will just need to write a few lines about yourself and why you are applying. The application form is attached to the Parentmail sent on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> October, or if you require a paper copy, please ask at the main office.
