Reminder

Please read ALL Parentmail notifications. There may be important information and/or changes to the school routine included. We will NOT be able to chase any unanswered messages and if we have not received a response from yourself regarding an activity/event/trip etc it may result in delays for your child being able to take part.

Attendance, Absences & Unauthorised Absence

"Every child has a right to an efficient and suitable full-time education and it is a parent's legal duty to ensure this happens. Where parents have chosen to register their child at a school, they must ensure their child attends school regularly.

It is well known that missing school for any reason can cause a child to fall behind in their learning. Missing school not only damages a pupil's learning and grades but can disrupt routines and can make children vulnerable to crime."

School Attendance and the Law

"The Education Act 1996 requires parents to ensure that their children of compulsory school age receive efficient full-time education suitable to their age, ability, aptitude, and to any special educational needs they may have.

A child is compulsory school age from the prescribed day following their 5th birthday. The prescribed days are; 1st September, 1st January and 1st April.

For example, if your child turns 5 on the 27th March 2020 then they will be compulsory school age from the 1st April 2020.

All children then remain of compulsory school age until the final Friday in June in the academic year in which they turn 16."

Our School's Attendance & Absence Policy reflects this guidance and advises parents and carers that if a child has 6 or more sessions (three school days) of unauthorised absence, parents/carers will incur a Penalty Notice for all children who are of compulsory school age.

Last year we had a significant number of term time holiday requests. Please be advised that unless there are exceptional circumstances, holiday taken within the term will NOT be authorised and a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Repeated absences that are deemed to be 'unauthorised' will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) and may result in further action being taken.

We would never expect a child who is unwell to attend school and we would like to work alongside you to support them and their needs, especially for those requiring a longer period of absence. In these circumstances, we work closely with the family on an 'individual basis', and will be advising the EWO of all special attendance plans in place.

Please be honest with us about the reason why your child is absent -the school has the right to question any absence that it feels may not be clear, ie. when it is reported that a child is unwell, and it is believed that they are on holiday. In these circumstances, proof of medical appointments etc. may be requested.

Our Attendance and Absence Policy is available on our website and a 'Quick Guide' will be following home shortly along with your child's Data sheet for checking and updating all the contact information in case of emergencies etc.

Forest School Sessions

After the success of last year's Forest Schools sessions, we are looking forward to starting them again. Each year group will work with Mrs Bennett twice a term for a morning or afternoon session in the school grounds. "Wild Wednesday" or "Forest Thursday" sessions will be linked to each year group's topic for the term and activities will be followed up in the classroom with the class teachers after the outdoor sessions.

This will give us all the opportunity to take our learning into our fabulous school grounds, learn new skills in a different environment away from the classroom and use the outdoor space to enhance our collaboration, communication and resilience.

Please see below for the dates that your child will be taking part. It is important that they come to school ready for a day outside regardless of the weather, in order to make sure they enjoy the experience.
